

Bill No. 58. By Senator Ford of the Eighth District entitled "An Act concerning Equal Rights," providing a fine of one hundred dollars to any person who discriminates on account of race, creed or color in any place of public accommodation, amusement, et cetera.

Senate Bill No. 121. By Senator Rogers of the Eighteenth District (by request), entitled "An Act concerning Civil Rights," providing for fine, jail and forfeit by anyone who discriminates because of color or race except for good cause.

Senate Bill No. 41. By Senator Macdonald of the Ninth District, entitled "An Act amending the Civil Rights Law," providing that no proprietor of any place of public accommodation, resort or amusement shall directly or indirectly refuse, withhold from or deny to any person any of the privileges thereof on account of race, creed or color, or display or publish any notice to that effect; also enumerating the places covered by the act and providing penalty for violation.

By Senator Dennis of the Second District entitled "An Act concerning Civil Rights," providing for a fine of one hundred dollars for any person who makes a discrimination on account of race or color in any place of public accommodation, amusement, public meeting, skating rink, public place of amusement, public place of business, public meeting inn, barber shop or public place of amusement.

Senate Bill No. 537. By Senator Golden of the Thirteenth District (by request), entitled "An Act concerning Equal Rights in Occupation Irrespective of Sex," providing that no person shall be disqualified from engaging in any occupation on account of sex.

Senate Bill No. 68. By Senator Bakewell of the Eighth District, entitled "An Act concerning Equal Rights in Places of Public Accommodation, Amusement Resort, Refreshment, and Education, and Providing Penalty for the Violation thereof," providing that equal rights shall be afforded to all persons within this state regardless of race, creed or color. Violations of the provisions of said section shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one hundred fifty dollars nor more than five hundred dollars to be recovered by the person aggrieved, and to a fine of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than five hundred dollars or imprisonment not less than thirty days nor more than ninety days or both.
